From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Grace, mercy, and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

In Genesis 1:27 we read these familiar words

²⁷So God created mankind in his own image,
in the image of God he created them;
male and female he created them.

Andrea often tells the story of her entrance into a male-dominated profession, that of funeral director. While her father, the founder of their funeral home, was serving in the Illinois State legislature, she, a recent college graduate, ran the business. Comments from colleagues were not flattering and there was very little encouragement forthcoming. The prediction was that she would run the business into the ground. Now, some forty years later, she is president and owner of Brookins Funeral Home, a business that celebrated, albeit lowkey, 50 years of service last year.

It is unfortunate that Andrea's story is not an anomaly. Throughout history, the stories of women tell of discrimination, misogyny, harassment, and abuse because of the failure of men to acknowledge God's placement of women in creation. The Church is not absent from that dark history, for it has (and still does in some places) engaged in its own hindrances of women and their causes. This leads us to March as Women's History Month.

The celebration of Women's History Month grew out of a weeklong celebration

of women's contributions to culture, history and society organized by the school district of Sonoma, California, in 1978. Presentations were given at dozens of schools, hundreds of students participated in a "Real Woman" essay contest and a parade was held in downtown Santa Rosa.

A few years later, the idea had caught on within communities, school districts and organizations across the country. In 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first presidential proclamation declaring the week of March 8 as National Women's History Week. The U.S. Congress followed suit the next year, passing a resolution establishing a national celebration. Six years later, the National Women's History Project successfully petitioned Congress to expand the event to the entire month of March.

As our nation celebrates the election and inauguration of our first woman Vice President, let us call to mind the shoulders of women upon whom she stands, many of them not notable but who simply reveled in their creation in God's image and who fought the evil, injustice, and oppression that came their way simply because of their gender. In this Women's History Month, let us call the role of women loudly enough so that their names are heard and acknowledged the other 11 months of the year.

In-Person Sunday School is happening again!!!

On February 21, we were happy to begin in-person Sunday school again. Sunday school begins at 9:45 and goes to 10:45. Youths attending 8:30 church service prior to Sunday School can go directly downstairs after service to the Wesley Wing, where we will sign them in for class. Parents of second grade and younger students are required to sign them in and out. Older students may sign themselves in and out. Youth not attending church prior to Sunday School are to enter in the lower west Wesley Wing doors to be checked in. **Pre-K-Kindergarten class will be done in person with Ms. Chris, and Zoom class will continue with Ms. Debbie. Senior High Sunday school will continue on Zoom as well. Adult Sunday school students attending 8:30 church service also may go directly to their Sunday school class, where their instructors will take attendance. Adults not attending church prior to Sunday school will need to check in at the office end church doors, where they will have a temperature check and receive hand sanitizer. **All students are to wear their masks.** Anyone in quarantine for COVID or COVID-like symptoms or exposure to someone with COVID should not attend Sunday School until 14 days from the onset of symptoms or exposure.

** The Wesley Sunday school class will continue to be held via Zoom.
